Please make sure that your child has a correct PE kit in school on these days.

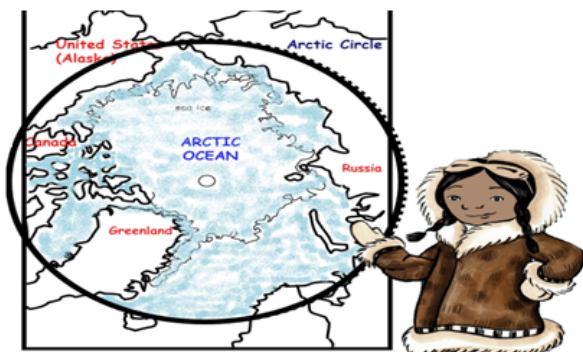
### Topic
